The Timberjack offense was clicking on all cylinders, led by tailback Randy Hoheneder, a Marinette native.

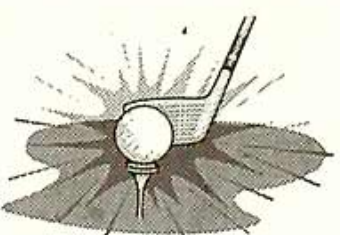

It wasn't easy for Zorn to beat the record of 250 holes set by Dan Kmiecik in May.

She had to start before 5 a.m., and after collapsing to the floor in exhaustion and fighting through huge hand and feet blisters, had to go back out (well, to accomplish a personal goal of 30 rounds, or 270 holes) and golf six holes in complete darkness.

She didn't do it alone. Her sister, Nicole, drove the cart for her from 9 a.m. on, and she would pull up as close to the ball as possible, so Kaitlyn could be as efficient as possible. Kaitlyn has stated that if anyone breaks her record, she will go out and try to take it back.

She had a total of 1,824 strokes on 270 holes, an average of just under 61 per nine holes.

Her best score was a 47, with her worst scores coming in the final two rounds, as she shot a 79 and a 114.

It's hard to look down on her final two scores, as Zorn could barely grip the club due to severe blisters. She also golfed the last six holes with a glow-in-the-dark ball.

Kaitlyn's parents, Bob and Lori Zorn, are considering planning an All-Day Marathon Golf for Charity because of the popularity of the promotion.

Kaitlyn, 15, will be a sophomore at Crivitz High School this fall.
